#### GPO, 1 Martin Place, Sydney - A historic address.

The Fullerton Hotel opens doors on Aussie shores. Tonight, marks the first night of business for The Fullerton Hotels and Resorts in Australia, with the company now in charge of the historic 1 Martin Place address in Sydney. Once the city's tallest building, Sydney's General Post Office has recently undergone a major makeover to its sandstone exterior with meticulous cleaning and restoration of its iconic façade. By member Tom Thorburn (VP) - On the 19<sup>th</sup> October the Westin Hotel in Martin Place was renamed the Fullerton Hotel and is situated in the building that was the former GPO.

I saw an advertisement in the newspaper asking for former employees of the GPO if they would be interested in telling of their experiences. Since the first job I got when I arrived in Sydney in 1951 was as a temporary mail sorter I replied.



I was videoed and photographed. Because of this I was invited to the official renaming.

The job entailed learning where the mail went in NSW which took 8 weeks. NSW was divided into regions (no postcodes then) and involved learning stories which tied the towns and communities together.
