#### **Member Profile: Tom Thorburn – Webmaster**

On Friday 18<sup>th</sup> August the Vietnam Veterans Day Commemorative Service was held in the St Marys RSL auditorium due to high winds. This year the focus was on the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the "Battle of Suoi Chau Pha – Honouring Their Service." A moving address was given by guest speaker Colonel Vo Dai Ton (Rdt) ARVN Special Forces. (Army of the Republic of Vietnam (ARVN) also known as the South Vietnamese Army, SVA.)

Six Australian soldiers from A Coy were killed in this battle and a further 19 wounded.


