# **2018 St Marys Spring Festival's 'Grand Parade'**



# School Visits - Erskine Park High School

# St Marys Public School Walk & Talk Tour

In August a walk and talk history tour started at 'Bronte' the home of Mr James Bennett of the famous firm of 'G & J Bennett' St Marys, wheelwrights and wagon builders, then powering up the hill to historic St Mary Magdalene Church, built in 1840. The students and teachers were able take in the beautiful interior including the coloured glass windows and memorial tablets dedicated to members of the King and Lethbridge families.

## Vietnam Veterans Day 18th August 2018

Several of our members attended this year's service held at the St Marys RSL Sub-Branch, Guns War Memorial. Due to high winds the service was relocated to the Auditorium of the St Marys RSL. The commemoration was well attended and a tribute was laid by the Society's President.

#### <u>Background to this Service</u> (Referenced from the programme)

The St Marys Vietnam Veterans Association Commemorative Service is held each year on the 18<sup>th</sup> August at 5.00pm

The 18<sup>th</sup> August was initially referred to as "Long Tan" Day in recognition of those who paid the supreme sacrifice during the Battle of Long Tan in South Vietnam in 1966.

The Prime Minister Bob Hawke formally declared the day 'Vietnam Veterans Day' on 18<sup>th</sup> August 1988 in recognition of all those that suffered and died as a result of the Vietnam War.

This special day of Commemoration is a result of recommendations of the Evatt Royal Commission, Vietnam Veterans Counselling Service and the 'After March Report' following the 'Welcome Home' Parade in Sydney in 1987.
