In June, members Caroline Volkiene, Norma Thorburn and Lyn Forde came to South Creek Park at St Marys to discuss the housing in the park of two more Bennett wagons by Penrith City Council. The project will see the construction of two pavilions to house the wagons that will result in a three-sided courtyard and an outdoor learning area. The existing pavilion will remain with the construction of the new area making use of recycled material that would otherwise been disposed in landfill. A number of materials identified for suitability to the construction are recovered hardwood fence palings, rusted tree grates and tree stumps for seating in the central courtyard of the pavilion. The whole project should take about five months to complete

The Bennett wagons were one of St Mary's manufacturing giants in the early days of the 1800's. The wagons were made firstly by James Bennett (Snr) in a shed behind the hotel now know as the Park View opposite Victoria Park. He was aided by blacksmith "Johnny Gotch" (John Sherringham) and when his sons took over parts of Queen Street with two Bennett factories their wagons were sent Australia wide. Many of the men of the district and around worked at the Bennett Wagon Works and our Society is blessed with a wonderful donation from a Bennett descendant Joan Dent of Victoria who has given the Society memorabilia belonging to the family.

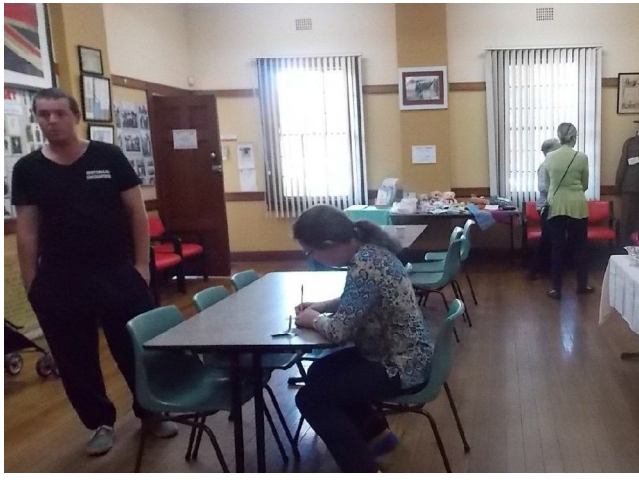

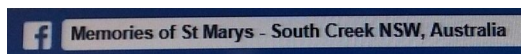
