MEMBERS WORKSHOPS POPPIES

Australia is commemorating it's involvement in the First World War of 1914-1918. The most recognised symbol of this war is the Flanders Poppy (Papaver Orientals) this poppy will only grow on disturbed ground and during the spring of 1915 the western front was awash with red poppies. At the Armistice talks in 1818 a US YMCA worker (Moina Michael) was reading a poem by John McCrae called "In Flanders Fields", it was then she decided to wear a red poppy in remembrance. The French Secretary of the YMCA (Madam Anna Guerin) liked Moina's idea so much that she had poppies made to be sold to help widows and orphans of this war. From this idea came the tradition of wearing the Flanders Poppy in memoriam. World-wide the people of countries that were involved in this Great War are making poppies so the ladies of the St Marys Historical Society decided to join in. Their idea is to make some wreaths for this commemoration and to crotchet the poppies. Some of the ladies did not know this craft but said they were willing to learn. So they had a day together for those that wanted to learn and learn they did with some often humorous but mostly very good results. We will look forward to seeing their finished wreaths. Note – Moina wrote a book on this called, "The Miracle Flower. The story of the Flanders Poppy".


