### Open Day at Historic Werrington House

Sunday the 18<sup>th</sup> October brought an overcast day for the Open Day of Historic Werrington House. The doors were open to the public for the first time in 183 years and our Society was honoured to be invited by the owners, Mr Peter Collins and his wife Mrs Jennine Leonarder-Collins to help bring this event together.

Several of our members dressed in 1830s period dress, gentlemen to welcome visitors at the main gate and the front of house, our ladies guided the public through the ground floor bringing attention to points of historical interest in each of the rooms.

Our thanks go to Steven Green, St John Ambulance and his team for providing first aid on the day. Also, to the members of the St Marys Rotary Club for cooking a tasty BBQ sausage sizzle.

Visitors were able to explore the grounds of the property and the "Garrison" containing both war and political memorabilia.

The day was a great success with attendance exceeding our wildest dreams, about 1000 visitors. Interest in local history is alive and well in our area and surrounds!

#### Coo-ee Re-enactment March - Commemorative Service and Breakfast, Victoria Park, St Marys NSW

As part of the 2015 ANZAC centenary commemorations, a re-enactment of the Coo-ee march followed the original march of 100 years ago. The original 515 km (320 miles) Coo-ee

recruitment march left Gilgandra with 26 men on 10 October 1915 and arrived in Sydney on 12 November, with 263 marchers who had joined along the way.

The re-enactment march entered Penrith City at the Great Western Highway near Lennox Bridge on Saturday 7 November and camped overnight at the Penrith Paceway. A Civic Reception was held that evening to welcome the Coo-ee March Re-enactment marchers to Penrith at the Sky Lounge. On Sunday 8 November, the marchers



continued along the Great Western Highway from High Street walking towards St Marys where a Commemorative Service and breakfast was held at the War Memorial in Victoria Park.




Our members were on hand to welcome the marchers into Victoria Park along with Scouts from across the St Marys district and schools. A beautiful spring day and Piper Ben Gerseach heralded the marchers who looked splendid in their blue uniforms and white hats. Dorothy Seale, a descendant of Sam Luke, placed a poppy that she had received from the Coo-ees. St

Marys Rotary provided a BBQ breakfast which was enjoyed by all and the marchers then moved onto Mt Druitt. Congratulations to St Marys RSL Sub-branch's Coo-ee Centenary Reenactment March, Local Support Committee, well done.

Samuel Luke joined the Coo-ees at Victoria Park on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> November 1915.

On 21<sup>st</sup> April 1917 during the First Battle of Bullecourt the 4<sup>th</sup> Pioneer Battalion was constructing tramways in the vicinity of Vaulx–Vraucourt, France when Private Luke was killed in action by a high explosive shell. He was buried in the Vaulx Hill Cemetery, France. Private Luke's name is also listed on the St Marys War Memorial.




