<u>2015 ANZAC Commemorations – WW1 Centenary</u>

On 19th April our members attended the St Marys ANZAC March and commemoration at Victoria Park. Several of our members dressed in 1915 period costume to acknowledge the 100th anniversary of the Gallipoli landing. We placed at the memorial a wreath of crochet poppies created by our members; and Gaye Nyhuis (Encore/CWA member) who kindly assembled the wreath. During the service Ron Kelly, President, St Marys RSL Sub-Branch presented our Society with a book titled "St Marys Served Australia in WW1". This book was the collation of a major research project initiated by the St Marys RSL Sub-Branch with local primary and high schools.


Other services attended were the Dawn Service held by the St Marys RSL Sub-Branch at the guns memorial and Banks Public School's ANZAC Centenary commemoration where the teachers and students had created a field of over 3000 poppies in the school's garden area and a display in the library.

On Sunday 31st May the Boer War commemoration was attended by members Caroline Volkiene, Jim Mason, and Norma and Tom Thorburn. This event took the theme; 'Fathers of ANZAC' as many Boer War veterans held senior positions in the AIF in Gallipoli and the Western Front; many used their experience of the Boer War to excel in their roles in WW1.


